Quick installation guide for the Information and Planning System (IPS) for Location-Adapted Mechanization Concepts

In the usual case, you receive the IPS as a ZIP archive file which contains:

⇒ the IPS Excel file,

⇒ a subfolder called "Pics", containing all the pictures of all machines in the IPS.

To install the IPS on your computer, please follow these instructions:

Extract the ZIP file in the Windows file explorer:

In the Windows file explorer, right-click on the ZIP file and chose "Extract all".

Browse to the folder on your computer, where you would like to install the IPS and confirm with "Extract" (or "OK").

To avoid Excel warning messages and manually activating macro code when opending the IPS, it is recommended to adjust the Excel settings as follows:

- \Rightarrow Open Excel <u>without</u> opening the IPS file.
- ⇔ In the Excel "File" menu, chose "Options"
- ⇒ On the left hand side, click on "Trust Center"
- ⇒ On the right hand side, click on "Settings for the Trust Center"
- On the left hand side, click on "Macro settings" ⇒
- ⇒ On the right hand side, chose "Enable all macros"
- ⇒ Leave the dialog with "OK"

Open the IPS Excel file:

Now you can open the IPS Excel file just like any other ordinary Excel file. You may simply double click on the file in the Windows file explorer or use the File-Open command in the Excel menu.

In case there will any warning messages be displayed by Excel (usually below the Excel "Ribbon" menu) after opening the IPS file, the following instructions may help you to get the file working.

Depending on your version of Excel, the appearance and/or wording of the messages may vary slightly.
